<p>Position Purpose</p> <p>This position reports to the Logistics Manager and together with the Transport Officer and Loco Driver Assistant is responsible for the safe and efficient operations of cane trains in order to satisfy customer requirements; empty and full deliveries on time and in full.</p> <p><i>Duties of this position include, but are not limited to:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Compliance with all relevant Company Policies and relevant legislation. • Train movement throughout the network including responsibility of loco driver assistant, track knowledge and be aware at all times. • Accurately recording and counting both full and empty cane bins. • Train reliability by constant observation of the train and accurate reporting of faults. • Acknowledging and monitoring two way radio messages. • Acknowledging the use of radio by assistant, standard signals and radio protocols. • Correct identification and operation of track components. • Excellent housekeeping in regard to loco cabins and equipment. • Performing loco pre start checks and servicing of the locomotive.

<p>Physical Requirements</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ability to perform work while wearing appropriate PPE (e.g. long clothing, hearing, eye protection and gloves). • Ability to perform work in a standing position for long periods in a vibrating environment. • Ability to walk and climb stairs regularly. • Ability to lift and carry loads in accordance with the Manual Tasks Advisory Standard 2000. • Hearing – ability to hear and differentiate radio and phone communications and alarms in a noisy environment. • Eyesight – ability to satisfy the vision requirements for a Qld Driver's Licence.
